Abstract: This paper investigated the peoples of Indian origin migrated or settled in different countries and contributing immensely in various aspects of life throughout the world. Their contributions have been recognized by different mediums of communication. One of the most popular and widely accessed medium Google has played a very important role in this regard. The well-known animated feature 'Doodle' of Google has been a recurring phenomenon on the front page of the search engine since 1998. It has celebrated the contribution of famous individuals and cultural events at global platform. The present study deals with the portrayal of Indian migrants by Google Doodles and analyses the news coverage of Doodles by digital news media. The findings of the paper show that the doodles represent the contribution of Indian migrants through its animated feature 'Doodle' and got a good amount of press coverage globally. Since 1998 to 2018 total 46 Indians and 16 People of Indian origin got homage by Google. Through the analysis of the news portals we have concluded that BBC.com is the only news portal that has never published any story related to Doodle but the news portal of Indian Express has given the maximum coverage for Google doodle. Thus, Google doodle has become a vital source of information and honorary tool for referencing contributions of individuals in the present society. It is also an established fact that the global reach of doodle is a significant aspect for the growing importance of doodles. Some of doodles like Amrita Shergil, Chandrashekhar Subhramanyan, M.F Hussain, Hargovind Khurana, Abdul Sattar Edhi, Fazlur Rehman have reached around 8 to 28 countries Google's home page. The present study has surprised to find that Doodles which are shown in India's Google home page or visa versa, were not displayed in neighbouring countries.

#### I. INTRODUCTION

Communication is an instrument that affects every living being, it is a most crucial aspect of human life and Media is the main source of knowledge and information for them; Presently, uses of Internet has exploded during the last few years, the new communication technology is growing rapidly and digital platform provides many opportunities for news mediums as well for the masses. The news portals on internet plays a key role in grabbing eyeballs of the readers and viewers with the potential of reaching millions.

Now, Google doodle is emerged as an important medium to portray special days, anniversaries and the lives of artists, pioneers and scientists of their respective fields, those who have helped to shape the history on global platform and now slipped under our radar or new generation. The first doodle about India was published on Independence Day and on Holi festival in 2001[1]. In India, we are shocked when Google published its animated feature(Doodle) of 'Rukhma bai Raut' 153rd Birth anniversary on 22 Nov. 2017, Google homepage [2]. Before this doodle appeared on screens across the country, Anandi bai Joshi was generally recognised as the first female doctor of the country. Hence google doodle helped us to discover many eminent Indians in their particular field and reintroducing some of the less known personalities and their contribution. The present study has taken new aspects for the research on Mass media technology and Google. Through the time many Indians have ventured out to different lands for various reasons and interest, like their political and religious matters, homelandconflicts, many of them went out in search of new opportunities or employment[3]. If we enumerate the characteristics of diasporic formation, it included migrants, political refugees, alien residents and immigrants. "Migrants term refers to movement of mass-migration or scattered populations who are living outside of their original homeland" [4]. The Indian migrants covers every part of the world [5]. Hence migrants and diaspora of India origin has widely existed community and Internet is only medium of communication that acceded and reached to the largest population of the world, and Google is the one of most used search engine for engaging Indian migrants through internet. Thus, it is important to understand the role of google doodle in representation of Indian migrants and find out the portrayal of Doodle in Indian news portals.

Before we proceed to next step, we understand the reach of Internet and Google:

According to United Nations, 15th meeting of the UN Broadband Commission for Sustainable Development [6], 4.3 billion people have using the Internet and reached to 56 per cent of the global population (See Fig.1.) [8].

Google has handle more than a billion (1,000,000,000) searches every day[7]. According to Net Market Share [7], the global marketing share percentage of google, in context of every year searches, Google have over 93.7%. Share to his credit. Hence, Google's search engine is a powerful tool to reached the audience globally.

- 1. How many Indian personalities were paid Homage by Google doodle?
- 2. Does online news media promote Doodle's and does highlighted their origin?
- 3. What was the global reach of Doodles through Google home page?
- 4. Is doodle developed as an effective tool for promotion of People on Global platform?

# V. METHODOLOGY

Keeping the study objectives in view the, authors adopted both qualitative and quantitative technique by exploring the different aspects of portrayal of Indian migrants on Google Doodle. The research work is analytical in nature.

The content of the research is based on information which is already available and accessible. It included in Google database, web media, news, articles, blogs etc. Therefore the qualitative analysis of the study is based on secondary data. News stories which have been used for content analysis are selected from top 10 Indian news portals. Suitable multivariate techniques was used for data analysis

#### A. Data Collection:

We used Google database at <a href="www.google.com/doodles/">www.google.com/doodles/</a> for find out the presentation of Indian migrants and global reach of the Doodle. The study has also selected Top 10 news

portals (2018) by **Alexa ranking**<sup>1</sup> for news coverage Analysis.

The parameters selected for analysis of Google Database are follows:

- Number of Indians
- Number of Indian Migrants
- Nationality (Pre-post)
- Doodle Reach

The parameters selected for analysis of Doodle News are follows:

- Number of News Coverage (using News Portals)
- Source of the news
- Headline
- Sub Headline
- Term used for Doodle personality
- Global Reach

#### VII. DATA COLLECTION

To understand the reach, portrayal of the news related to particular Indian Migrants in the context of term used for origin in headline and sub headline, the study has selected and analysed some news portals for coverage of Google doodle Indian Diaspora personalities (Selection of news website based on Top 10 news portals by Alexa ranking.

#### 1) Amrita Shergil

Amrita Sher-Gil was born on 30 January 1913 in India and then move to Hungary with her father. she has been recognised one of the greatest women artists of the early 20th century. Google was published a Doodle about this Indian Hungarian painter to pay tribute her contribution on in the field of art on []. (see **Table I**) indicates out of 10 online news portals seven covered the doodle story and three of them did not mention about the personality. The analysis of news portal with respect to origin affiliation to the personality was Indo-Hungarian to promoting her Origin. Amrita Sher Gil doodle was highlighted in 14 countries Google's home page but not was in Neighbouring countries of India.

#### 2) Subrahmanyan Chandrashekhar

Subrahmanyan Chandrasekhar was born on 19 October 1910 in Lahore, India. He moved to America and spent his professional life in the United States. He was awarded with the Nobel Prize for Physics in 1983 for "Theoretical studies of the physical processes of importance to the structure and evolution of the stars known as The Chandrasekhar limit" [9]. See Table (II) indicate out of 10 online news portals seven gave coverage to the doodle story and three of them ignored the personality. The analysis of news portal with respect to origin affiliated to the Doodle personality was Indian America for promoting his origin. S Chandrashekhar doodle was widely promoted in nearly 28 countries but were not highlighted on Neighbouring countries Google's home page.

#### 3) Pandit Ravi Shankar

Pandit Ravi Shankar's 96th birth anniversary with a Doodle[10]. Pandit Ravi Shankar born on 7 April 1920, was the virtuoso sitar maestro who introduced Indian classical music to the world and inspired the Sixties 'psychedelic' sound through his collaboration with the Beatles.

See Table (III) indicate only 5 online news portals highlighted the doodle story. The Diaspora factor of Pandit Ravi Shankar was not specified by the news-portals but all of them highlighted his Indian origin. The doodle of Pandit Ravi Shankar was also exhibited in 12 countries except neighbours countries Google's home page.

Google has celebrated M.F Husain's 100th Birthday through dedicated Doodle to him on September 17, 2015 [11]. the doodle reached various parts of the world. Hussain also known as the Picasso of India, when some of his works stirred controversy in India he was moved to London and after some time he got citizenship of Qatar.

**Table 4.** Reveals that except BBC.co all other news portal gave prominence to the doodle story. The M.F. Hussain Qatri nationality was mentioned in every news coverage. The doodle of M.F. Hussain was exhibited in 9 countries except neighbours countries Google's home page.

### 5) Coenelia Sorabji

Google has paid tribute first woman lawyer of India Cornelia Sorabji through a dedicated doodle on the occasion of her 151st birth anniversary[12]. The doodle was shows as Cornelia Sorabji in front of Allahabad High Court. Sorabji retired from the high court in 1929, and settled in London, where she passed away on July 6, 1954. Table (V) indicates seven news portals highlighted the doodle story and other had no mention of the personality. The Indian origin and contribution of Cornelia Sorabji was given prominence in all published stories. The doodle was only exhibited in India.

Dr Har Govind Khurana was born in 9 January 1922. He moved from India to United States in 1966. He got Nobel Prize for Physiology and the National Medal of Science in 1987[12]. (See **Table 6**) reveals that except BBC.co, all other selected news portal gave prominence to the doodle story. Har Gobind Khurana was affiliated as Indian American by all the portals news coverage. The doodle exhibited in 13 countries including India but not was in any Neighbouring countries Google's Home page.

#### 7) Fazlur Rahman Khan

Fazlur Rahman Khan was born in April 1929, Bengal, India(now Bangladesh) Google has celebrated the 88th birthday anniversary of structural engineer. He is best known for designing Chicago's Sears Tower[12]. he is recognised for his pioneering work in skyscraper design and known to be the "father of tubular designs" for high-rises.

Table (VII) reveals that only Indian Express and India Today carried a story on Fazlur Rahman and other had no mention of the personality. The British India origins of Fazlur Rahmans were given prominence. The doodle was strikingly exhibited in 13 countries (Columbia, US, Cuba, UK, Iceland, Portugal, Ireland ,Greece, Sweden, Ukraine, Belarus, Japan, Bangladesh) but not in India.

Table:09 reveals that there was no story about Edhi contribution in any Indian Newspaper but so many news portals of different countries highlighted the story about his Doodle. hence his origins were not discussed. the doodle was strikingly exhibited in 13 countries (United states, United Kingdom, Ireland, ,Iceland, Portugal, Sweden, Denmark, , Greece, Estonia, south Korea, Japan, Pakistan, Australia, New Zealand) but not was in India.

Sadequain were mention by Indian Express. The doodle was strikingly exhibited in 13 countries but not in India.

Total 45 Indian personalities appeared as doodle over the eighteen years (2000-2018), (<a href="www.google.com/doodles">www.google.com/doodles</a>) and 16 Indian Migrants (Born in India) personalities who were projected by Google doodle. See, table (XVII) listed below:

As per findings (see Table: 17, Figure: 3) *Indian Express* has given *maximum coverage* to the personalities displayed by Google Doodle. Only Seven personalities Abdul Sattar Edhi, Noor Jehan, Humayun Ahmed, Feroza Begum, Fatima Surayya Bajia, Shamsur Rahman, Mehdi Hassan, Hanif Mohammad were not mentioned in any of the Indian News portal and not shown on Google India Home page. Although The Migrant Indians who were migrated before 1947 to neighbouring or another countries are not displayed in Indian homepage.




Fig. 5. Total coverage given by News portals about Doodles of Indian Migrants

BBC.co (British Broadcast corporation) was the only news portal that never published a doodle story. Yahoo.co.in has also ignored maximum doodle stories as it has been the competitor of Google. It was noted that the current nationality and post Indian Independence nationality was given more prominence in the news stories. It is also established that google Doodle used as a tool of referencing and honouring instrument for the Civil Society.



One of the striking facts about doodle is that all those personalities who were shown through doodle in India were are not displayed in neighbouring countries (China, Bhutan, Myanmar, Pakistan, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka) Google's home page and vice-versa (See, Table. XVII) for unknown reason even though the personalities are well known in India, Pakistan and Bangladesh. Most of the Headlines and sub headlines of the news portal starting with 'know more about, who is, why doodle celebrated the personality', so we concluded that doodle is established as a tool of remembering personalities and their contribution. The other important finding was that the many of Indian doodle reach has completely ignored in, Gulf countries and China.

#### IX. CONCLUSION

The study has established the facts that doodle is one of the most, infect only medium which portrays and highlights the immense contribution of People of Indian Origin. It has become and vital source of information regarding the contribution and achievements of forgotten legends of India. It is interesting to find that Google has portrayed 46 Indians through doodle in the last eighteen years. Apart from these 46 Indians, 16 Peoples of Indian origin have also been portrayed in Google doodles.

The study also analysed ten famous news portals to know the publication of news related to Indian Migrants and it was found that the maximum coverage in this regard had been given by the Indian express followed by NDTV and Hindustan Times. At the same time it was very surprising to find that the internationally famous British Broadcast Corporation (BBC) didn't cover any news related to the doodles of Indian migrants. The study also proved that the information shared through doodle is being used as reference at global level.

One of the most striking findings of this study is the denial of the portrayal of the People of Indian origin through Google doodle in the neighbouring countries, especially in China, Pakistan, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka and some gulf countries. So the present study raised a question that this denial of representation of Indian Migrants doodle on border states Google's home page is an intentional or unintentional attempt? This question will paved the way of further research in this field.
